
Rugby League in New Zealand

The history of rugby league in New Zealand began as a humble story of working-class communities and a popular ball game that felt like "being part of a large family". Always a minority sport alongside rugby, it put down strong roots and flourished throughout the regional heartlands, before emerging into the mainstream in the 1980s.

Ryan Bodman was awarded a Research Grant from the Friends of Turnbull Library in 2017, and his beautifully illustrated history won this year's illustrated non-fiction prize in the Ockham NZ Book Awards.
